CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were: Kevin Walsh, Jim Gurzler, Lena Fowler, Karen Trubela & Bryan Chittester. Atty. John Lucas & General Manager, Robert Rosner were also present. Brian Griffith was absent.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The October 2019 Executive Session minutes were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Financials for October were approved. The Finance Committee met in November to discuss the August & September financials as well as the 2020 proposed budget.

LEGAL REPORT: No report.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: QHV reported that they are excited that they will be launching their own website and a photographer will be in the community photographing the beauty of BML.

MANAGER REPORTS: Robert Rosner read the GM and the Maintenance report.

RECREATION REPORT: Karen Amici read the Recreation Dept. report.

ACC, CEO & ROVING REPORT: Karen Amici read the ACC, CEO & ROVING report.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee is organizing the Community XMAS tree decorating on Dec 1st and the Christmas Craft event on December 3rd.

EAP COMMITTEE: Karen Amici will be attending a required DEP class on November 21st in Harrisburg. This is the beginning of the revised DEP process regarding the electronic filing of the emergency action plan to the DEP required for the EAP plan for the dam. Once this is filed, the EAP plan for the community must be further developed, communicated and implemented.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: No report.

OWNER COMMENTS:

An owner asked about the Code Enforcement Position. The GM answered that the position was advertised on Facebook and Constant Contact with little interest. The position will be advertised on Indeed. An owner commented about dead trees possibly in the green space. The GM responded that Schumacher Engineering came out to resurvey the two lots and will provide a report to him regarding the property line delineations. An owner asked if there was any change made by M & J Excavating once the Debbie Dr. culvert pipes were replaced. The GM answered there were no changes made. The same owner asked what is the penalty for an owner not having an ACC permit. Karen Amici responded that the current policy is to send the owner a letter indicating that the work was done without a permit and that they have 30 days to pay for and apply for the permit and/or the security deposit or face a \$50 fine. The Board will look into increasing the fine amount. An owner asked about the water extraction project and the status. The SRBC is still reviewing the request, however, the owners are encouraged to write and petition their elected officials, AQUA, the DEP and the SRBC to express their concerns. The Board is also looking into organizing a meeting at BML in January 2020 to discuss all of the issues concerning this proposed project. Once the meeting is finalized the ownership will be notified of the date and time. The GM will prepare standardized letters for the ownership to utilize for this purpose.

GARDENING CORNER

TIPS FROM PENN STATE **MASTER** GARDENERS



HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

Another growing season has drawn to a close in Beech Mountain. We have the residual leaves to clear off turf lawns and the ever falling twigs and branches to clean up as well.

Our late November snow has flattened many ornamental grasses, and this is the perfect time to (Just Google the title,) prune the dead stems. A small grass plant can be Trust me, you can find the cut back using hand pruners. Hedge clippers work well on larger clumps. A really large grass plant might require a chain saw. Cut all the stems to about 3-4 inches above the ground. While the dead stems can be left on the plants they should be pruned before new growth begins in the spring.

WHY WON'T MY TREES' LEAVES DROP?

At northern latitudes, nearly all deciduous trees lose their leaves in winter. On some trees, however, the leaves die but they don't drop from the branches. This phenomenon is called marcescence and is most often observed on American Beech, though some oaks and other species will do it as well. Typically only young saplings, or the younger growth of lower branches on older trees, will have marcescent leaves. Most trees develop a layer between the twig and the leaf stem that loosens and separates, eventually allowing the leaf to pull free from gravity or wind, but with marcescent leaves, this layer doesn't form, and the old leaves are usually only finally

pushed off by new buds as they develop in the spring.





SELECTING AND MANAGING A REAL CHRISTMAS TREE

If you have decided to scrap the artificial tree and purchase a real tree this year, there are a few things to consider to get and keep the best tree possible. There are quite a few different varieties of evergreen trees being sold this year, and a little research can aid you in selecting the best tree for your home.

An excellent on-line, illustrated guide to varieties of Christmas trees is available from Perdue Extension. The free publication is called Selecting an Indiana Grown Christmas Tree.

listed varieties here in Pennsylvania as well. The guide includes pictures and a table of the characteristics of 8 commonly grown Christmas trees.

Winter "Do's & Don'ts

Remember:

When the snowflakes start flying, please keep in mind a few do's and don'ts:

- -Do keep access to your mailbox cleared for postal service; this is the responsibility of the resident.
- -Do not shovel or snow plow onto the road.
- Do not park on the street during snow removal time.

Mailboxes:

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will only repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are actually struck by the plow blade. Usually a paint mark or tire tracks from the truck will be evidence of the mailbox or post actually being hit by the plow.

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will not repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are damaged or fall over from the force of plowed snow and are not directly hit by the plow.

Mailboxes and supporting posts must be strong enough and installed in such a way to withstand the weight and force of snow removal including the force of snow pushed from the streets onto the side of the road.

Contact the Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Administration office if you have a damaged mailbox.

Cars Parked on Roads - Do Not Park on the Street

Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. has the responsibility of clearing the Associations roads of snow and ice from winter storms. Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. takes this responsibility seriously since it is for the safety and welfare of our residents and children.

In order to assist the Snow Plowing Contractor during snow removal, we suggest the following:

- 1. Do not park in the street The snow plows are unable to perform their jobs properly with a vehicle in their way.
- 2. Do not shovel or plow snow from your driveway or walkway into the street, this creates a hazardous condition for all vehicles.
- 3. If your vehicle should become stuck in the snow, do not abandon it in the roadway. Please contact a tow truck company.
- When following a salt truck, keep a safe distance. Expect trucks to make sudden stops or turns while in the operation of snow removal.

During Snow Storms, Please Drive Safely. Make sure to leave early and give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination, so that you can take your time during winter conditions.
