



CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were: Kevin Walsh, Jim Gurzler, Linda Jo Robbins, Lena Fowler and Kevin Ferra. Jacob Meyer attended via conference call. Atty.Baranko and General Manager Edward Florentino were also present. Board of Director Elect David Davis was also present.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The October 28, 2020 Executive Meeting minutes were approved. TREASURER'S REPORT: The Board approved the September and October 2020 financials.

LEGAL REPORT: No report.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: Quail Hollow reported they have been hit hard with break-ins at both vacant and occupied units. Quail Hollow requests everyone keep their eyes and ears open and contact Security and QHV if you see anything out of the ordinary. QHV is looking into purchasing cameras.

MANAGER REPORTS: Ed Florentino read the GM report. Karen Amici read the Maintenance and ACC, CEO & ROVING reports. Jackie Rydzefski read the Recreation report.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee is sponsoring a wreath and basket raffle. Proceeds to go to the Valley Food Pantry. There will be a XMAS tree lighting at the clubhouse on 11/29/20 from 4-6pm.

EAP COMMITTEE: No report.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: Chris Blazic indicated that the Committee has sent 26 policies to the GM for review. The Cmte will be working with the GM moving forward. The Cmte is requesting that the new board finish the project to completion.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Dave Davis reported that the 2021 budget will be voted on at the December 9th meeting. The next Finance Cmte meeting will be 1/18/21.

OWNER COMMENTS:

An owner commented that she is getting her information regarding the break-ins from Next Door. She is willing to teach gun safety to any owner requesting training. An owner suggested forming at Town Watch in BML. An owner asked when the 1st incident happened at Quail Hollow. It was discovered on Friday morning and reported to BTPD. An owner commented that the bell that is supposed to alert the guards in the shack when a vehicle pulls into BML is still not going off. The same owner commented that another month has gone by without 1 citation being issued. An owner commented that the potholes at Trapper Springs & Four Seasons are still not patched. An owner commented that he saw a new Maintenance truck and wanted to know how much it cost-\$33,0000.00 the GM responded. Another owner commented did the truck come with a plow package, trailer package? Did anyone review any options for a less expensive truck? The GM reviewed several options and presented them to the Board. An owner commented that there is an outhouse in the front of a yard. The outhouse is decorative and is not a functioning outhouse. An owner commented that there seems to be a lot of rentals at QHV and they should be paying a rental fee. QHV has been renting their units for years and are not subject to the fee and are not going to pay a fee. An owner commented that the road contractor did a pretty good job this year with paving, but did not do the entire road shoulders with stone. The GM will look into bringing them back to do the complete shoulder work. An owner commented that the heat in the racquetball court is way too hot and needs to be adjusted. An owner commented about the trailer on the opposite side of the lake. The GM is keeping on top of the happenings across the lake.

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

As we come to the end of this very different year we can be thankful for a break from yard and garden chores. It is a good time to relax and think about the fact that our gardens are to be a source of joy. To paraphrase those decluttering experts, if it doesn't bring you joy stop doing it.

Plan a garden or landscape that brings you joy in the creating and maintaining as well as in its appearance.

Take time to notice and say thanks for the beautiful decorations your neighbors here in Beech Mountain are sharing with us.

CARING FOR A REAL CHRISTMAS TREE

Here are some tips to help you keep it fresh through the holiday season. For best results, follow these tips from the time you purchase your tree until you remove it from your home.

- Use a tree stand that holds 1 quart of water per inch of stem diameter and keep the water level above base of tree at all times. The temperature of the water used to fill the stand is not important.
- Tree trunk too wide for the tree stand? Buy a larger stand, do NOT whittle the trunk!
- Storing a tree for a few days? Put trunk in water and store in a cool, shaded and protected area.
- More than 12 hours since harvest? Cut off about ¼" from the base to improve water uptake. Do not angle or v-cut.
- Keep trees away from sources of heat (direct sunlight, heat vents, etc.) and keep the room cool.
- It is NOT worth it to: drill holes in the base, use "I-V" type devices, apply anti-transpirants or add anything to the water in the stand.
- Proper tree care and watering reduces fire hazards more than spraying trees with flame retardants.
- Run your fingers across the needles. If they break easily or fall off in your hand, the tree is dry and should be removed from the house.

GIFT SUGGESTIONS FOR GARDENERS

Gardeners both young and old love to receive garden related gifts.

With a reminder to keep a child's age and experience in mind, these gifts can nurture interest in gardening during winter months:

- Amaryllis or paper-white narcissus bulbs, some come in a kit complete with a pot;
- Bird feeders and bird houses require involvement and can help young gardeners learn about seed mixes and birds that visit the feeders or that choose the houses.
- Weather gadgets such as an outdoor thermometer or rain gauge.

Adults may appreciate a gift of living plants and many types are available in December. Consider the bulbs mentioned above along with Poinsettias, Cyclamens, and Christmas cacti. A gift certificate to your local greenhouse or nursery may deliver a dwarf fruit tree, rose

bushes, or summer annuals.

If you do choose Amaryllis or paper- white narcissus, make sure that the bulb has not sprouted in the container before you purchase it. If the bulbs are for an adult consider planting them before Christmas since it takes six to eight weeks for these bulbs to produce blooms.

Winter "Do's & Don'ts



Remember:

When the snowflakes start flying, please keep in mind a few do's and don'ts:

- -Do keep access to your mailbox cleared for postal service; this is the responsibility of the resident.
- -Do not shovel or snow plow onto the road.
- -Do not park on the street during snow removal time.

Mailboxes:

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will only repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are actually struck by the plow blade. Usually a paint mark or tire tracks from the truck will be evidence of the mailbox or post actually being hit by the plow.

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will not repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are damaged or fall over from the force of plowed snow and are not directly hit by the plow.

Mailboxes and supporting posts must be strong enough and installed in such a way to withstand the weight and force of snow removal including the force of snow pushed from the streets onto the side of the road.

Contact the Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Administration office if you have a damaged mailbox.

Cars Parked on Roads - Do Not Park on the Street

Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. has the responsibility of clearing the Associations roads of snow and ice from winter storms. Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. takes this responsibility seriously since it is for the safety and welfare of our residents and children.

In order to assist the Snow Plowing Contractor during snow removal, we suggest the following:

Do not park in the street The snow plows are unable to perform their jobs properly with a vehicle in their way.

Do not shovel or plow snow from your driveway or walkway into the street, this creates a hazardous condition for all vehicles.

If your vehicle should become stuck in the snow, do not abandon it in the roadway. Please contact a tow truck company.

When following a salt truck, keep a safe distance. Expect trucks to make sudden stops or turns while in the operation of snow removal.

<u>During Snow Storms, Please Drive Safely. Make sure to leave early and give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination, so that you can take your time during winter conditions.</u>


