- Approved October 27th & November 4th, 2021 Board Meeting Minutes.

 - Continuing to rewrite rental policy both as it relates to the elimination of short-term rentals (BTZC 2014 Ordinance) and revising the long-term rental policy to increase the effectiveness of administrative controls.

 - Emergency response team is in the final stages of being formed.
 - "Community Watch" function is being formed with a tentative launch date of Spring 2022.
 - School bus stop safety continues to be a current priority.
- **Recreation/Volunteer (Blanche Brennan)**
 - Met on November 8th.
 - Tree lighting is scheduled for December 4th.
 - Working with Recreation Department on winter events for the ice rink & ski slope.

Questions/Comments from Residents (approximately 20 individuals):

- Many comments & questions related to the impact that the BTZC's short term rental amendment (7/14/2020) to the 2014 Zoning Ordinance would have on both BML (lake homes) and Quail Hollow. BML Advisory Committee continues to work on revising our current rental policy to address the short-term rental issue. Quail Hollow's hearing with Butler Township has been delayed until January.
- Questions relative to both our new security service as well as our efforts to consider reconfiguring the main entrance to add actual gates were discussed.
- Concerns relative to our current lack of a second exit were discussed. The Public Safety Committee was requested to add the issue to their agenda.
- Amy Anthony discussed the communities' current efforts to spay/neuter and rehome the neighborhood stray cats. Results to date have been encouraging. Amy is looking for additional volunteers and financial support to grow the program.

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

This month's Tips article is by John Porter the Urban Agriculture Program Coordinator/Educator for Nebraska Extension.

POINSETTIAS

The holiday season creeps earlier and earlier each year, at least here in the US. But some holiday traditions can't be rushed, like live holiday plants. Many of these picky plants have to be bought and cared for closer to the holidays, We have amaryllis, paperwhites, cyclamen, Norfolk Island pines, and more that make up our usual holiday decor. But none are so vibrant and indicative of the holiday as the poinsettia..

While we enjoy poinsettias for their bright colors, it would be incorrect to say that poinsettias have large, colorful blooms. The colors that we see are called bracts — brightly colored leaves. These bracts change color much the same way leaves change color in the fall: They lose their green chlorophyll to expose the color beneath. This happens when the flowers, those ugly little yellowish lumps in the middle of the bract, mature.

Poinsettias are famous for having a difficult blooming process. The plants are considered short day plants, though the more accurate description would be a long night plant. This means that in order to set blooms, the plant needs a few weeks where it receives at least 12, and preferably 16, hours of uninterrupted darkness each night. Even a few seconds of light in the middle of the night can stop, interrupt, or delay the process. This often makes saving poinsettias from year to year difficult.

While the red poinsettia lends itself to the classic col-

ors of Christmas, it might be hard to figure out how this weed from Mexico found its way to the top of the list of traditional holiday plants. After all, it is a much more recent addition to the holiday decoration arsenal than the evergreens borrowed from ancient pagan rituals.

The poinsettia is a native plant that can grow as a fairly large shrub or tree in Mexico. The original name used for the plant, prior to Americanization, was *cuetlaxochitl*!

Franciscan friars included the vivid plants in Christmas celebrations in the 17th century. In Mexico, the plant is also known as *Flor de Nochebuena*, or Holy Night Flower.

The poinsettia really didn't come into its current fame until it was introduced to the United States in 1825, at the hands of a politician. It just so happened that the first U.S. minister to Mexico was an amateur botanist. He brought the plant back to his private hothouses in South Carolina, and then shared it with friends who introduced the plant to the nursery trade. It filled an empty spot in the nursery calendar, so nurseries were quick to embrace the plant.

The plant was renamed *Poinsettia* in honor of the man who brought it to the country — Joel Roberts Poinsett. His contribution to the plant's history and the nursery business in the U.S. was honored by Congress, which has declared Dec. 12 National Poinsettia Day.

The poinsettia didn't become common holiday fair for the general masses until Paul Ecke Sr., a German immigrant living in California started growing them on a large scale. Ecke and family were also responsible for breeding poinsettias, turning them from a weedy plant in to the more robust, bushy form we see today. While the Ecke family has moved a lot of production overseas, they are still responsible for 70% of the poinsettias sold in the US and nearly half of all poinsettias sold worldwide.

Winter "Do's & Don'ts"

Remember:



When the snowflakes start flying, please keep in mind a few do's and don'ts:

- Do keep access to your mailbox cleared for postal service; this is the responsibility of the resident.
- Do not shovel or snow plow onto the road.
- Do not park on the street during snow removal time.

Mailboxes:

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will only repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are

actually struck by the plow blade. Usually a paint mark or tire tracks from the truck will be evidence of the mailbox or post actually being hit by the plow.

The Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Snow Plow Contractor will not repair or replace mailboxes or posts that are damaged or fall over from the force of plowed snow and are not directly hit by the plow.

Mailboxes and supporting posts must be strong enough and installed in such a way to withstand the weight and force of snow removal including the force of snow pushed from the streets onto the side of the road.

Contact the Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. Administration office if you have a damaged mailbox.

Cars Parked on Roads - Do Not Park on the Street

Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. has the responsibility of clearing the Associations roads of snow and ice from winter storms. Beech Mountain Lakes Association Inc. takes this responsibility seriously since it is for the safety and welfare of our residents and children.

In order to assist the Snow Plowing Contractor during snow removal, we suggest the following:

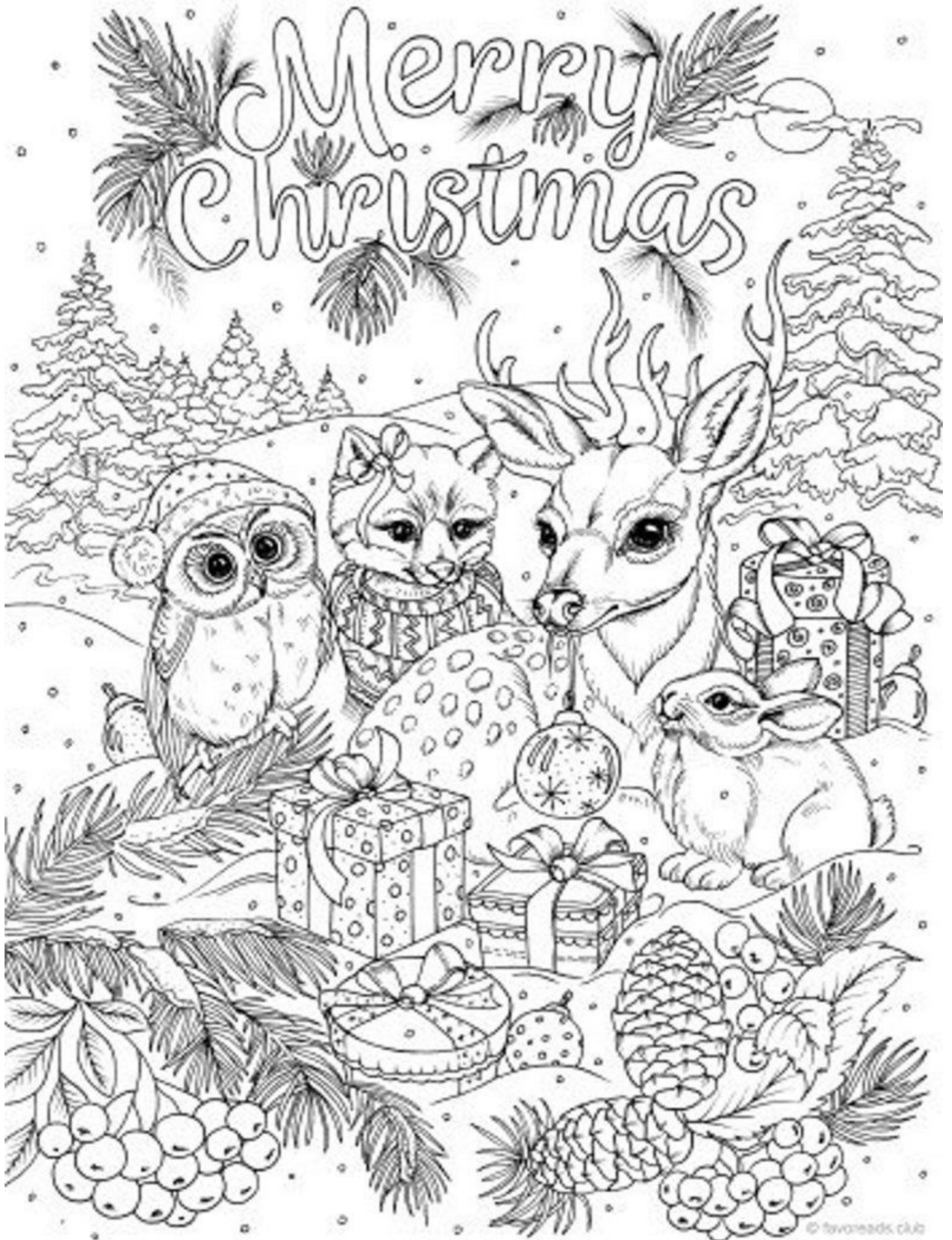
Do not park in the street The snow plows are unable to perform their jobs properly with a vehicle in their way.

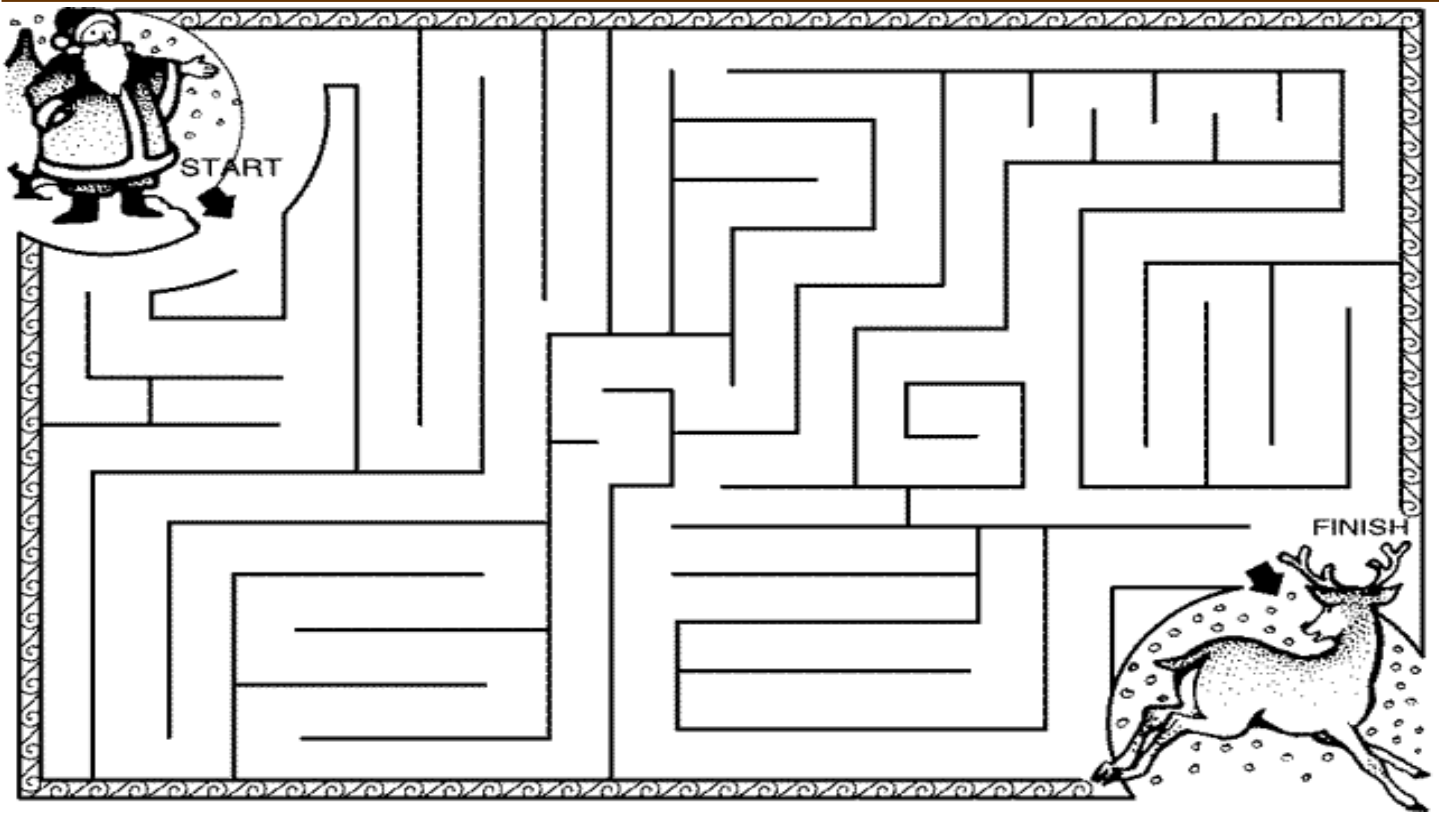
Do not shovel or plow snow from your driveway or walkway into the street, this creates a hazardous condition for all vehicles.

If your vehicle should become stuck in the snow, do not abandon it in the roadway. Please contact a tow truck company.

When following a salt truck, keep a safe distance. Expect trucks to make sudden stops or turns while in the operation of snow removal.

During Snow Storms, Please Drive Safely. Make sure to leave early and give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination, so that you can take your time during winter conditions.
