BEECH MOUNTAIN LAKES ASSOCIATION, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OPEN SESSION JUNE 24, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were: Kevin Walsh, Jim Gurzler, Jo Robbins. Acting General Manager Karen Amici was also present. Karen Trubela participated in the Executive Session in-person. Bryan Chittester, Kevin Ferra and Attorney Joseph Baranko all participated in the Executive Session via teleconference call.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The May 2020 Executive Session minutes were approved. **TREASURER'S REPORT:** The Financials for not ready for review due to a computer issue in the Admin Office. The Financials for May will be reviewed once the new hardware is installed and the data restored. The Finance Committee will meet once the Financials are presented. **LEGAL REPORT:** No report.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: No report.

MANAGER REPORTS: Karen Amici read the Maintenance report.

RECREATION REPORT: Karen Belair read the Recreation Dept. report.

ACC, CEO & ROVING REPORT: Karen Amici read the ACC, CEO & ROVING report.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee has not met since COVID.

EAP COMMITTEE: Karen Amici continues to work on the electronic upload of the plan.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: The Committee has completed their review of the rules, regulations and policies. The Committee is requesting a meeting with the Board and the Acting GM to review their proposed revisions.

OWNER COMMENTS:

An owner asked if the Board has considered a dues reduction due to some of the amenities not being opened due to COVID. The Board has not considered any reduction in the dues for 2020 due to COVID. An owner asked why the newsletter has not been out in two months. The Acting GM indicated that there has been nothing open and that a newsletter will be out sometime in July. All relevant information is being disseminated on both the website and via the emailer system. An owner asked about parking outside of the restaurant. Signs will be put up in the next few weeks better defining the parking area. The same owner asked about employees parking by the restaurant. The Acting GM will direct the employees not to park in this area. An owner asked about when the search for a GM will resume. The Board will decide when the search will resume. The Board is working together with the Acting GM in continuing the operation of the Association. An owner asked about Code Enforcement. The Acting GM indicated that Code Enforcement will be resuming in the next week. Several owners complained about Security allowing persons to their property without being called-in or arriving without a pass. The Acting GM encouraged owners to contact her at the Administration Office with issues concerning Security and not to wait until the Board Meeting so they can be addressed as they occur. The Acting GM meets regularly with the Security Supervisor and needs to be aware of the issues so they can be addressed timely. An owner inquired if the Association received a PPP Loan. The Acting GM replied yes, in the amount of \$88,700.00 and it will be converted into a grant within the 24 week conversion timeframe. It will be used to offset labor costs for the departments with considerably reduced revenue.



GARDENING CORNER



TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

Can our traditional summer be 1/3 gone already. It seems that the Corona virus has taken a lot of summer as well as a lot of jobs and lives. I hope all of you are staying safe and staying well. There are lots of summer chores remaining on my list. I am sure many of you are still catching up as well. The weather has been very favorable for our garden plants and lawns but that makes it necessary for more mowing and trimming. Take advantage of the chance to get out and enjoy.

GNATS, GNATS, GNATS.

We have seen a major increase in these pesky insects this year. Research suggests that some of these bugs are attracted to fluid in your eyes (tears.) Insect repellents seem to have minimal effect on deterring gnats. I have found that the readily available head nets are very effective in keeping these bugs out of my eyes, ears, nose and mouth when I am out in the garden or walking the dog.

RIGHT PLANT RIGHT PLACE!

The key to successful gardening and landscape is putting the right plant in the right place. That means doing some research on the plants you buy, and the location where you want to plant them.

Here in Beech Mountain we need to consider that many of our locations are in the shade most of the day. In addition we have the ever present deer to consider as well. So read those plant labels carefully. Before you buy, take some time to search the internet for characteristics and growing requirements. In particular find out how fast a plant grows and how big it

will get. Talk to your neighbors about plants they have had success with and plants the deer are not bothering.

When planting be aware of overhead wires and underground utilities. You will have more gardening success if you put the right plant in the right place.

DWARF ALBERTA SPRUCE

A popular and relatively easy to grow shrub here in Beech Mountain is the dwarf Alberta Spruce *Picea* glauca var. albertiana f. conica. This variety was



discovered in the wild by two Harvard University botanists in Canada in 1904. It is a dwarf variety of the white spruce, a tree that grows up to 100 feet.

The dwarf variety rarely grows more than 12-15 feet tall and has a compact conical shape popular with landscapers. It is not bothered by deer, a major advantage here in Beech Mountain.

Dwarf Alberta Spruce are easy to grow if planted in well drained soil in full sun. They will tolerate some shade, but tend to attract more diseases and insects in the shade. They are slow growers adding only 2 to 4 inches each year. Most of the green needles are on the outer few inches of the tree. Pruning into the brown interior may result in a long lasting brown hole in the body of the tree.

Dwarf Alberta Spruce trees can attract spider mites and should be checked regularly for this persistent pest. Avoid planting these trees too close together because they will eventually merge into one misshapened plant. You should also avoid planting them too close to buildings and walks. Given room to grow, these are long lived additions to your landscape.
