

Gardening Corner 15

TIPS From Penn State Master Gardeners



Hello Beech Mountain Gardeners!

Summer has arrived at last. Slow down and take some time to enjoy all the summer wildflowers and colorful annuals and perennials planted by residents here in Beech Mountain.

I am enjoying my traditional container garden blooming on my deck. I have one persistent pest in the form of a digging squirrel who seems intent on reaching the bottom of every pot and container I have planted. I don't know what he is looking for, but so far, he hasn't found it!

Spotted Lanternfly



When I first wrote about spotted lanternfly in this column 4 years ago, it was limited to 5 counties. Since then it has spread into 45 Pennsylvania Counties. In addition to Pennsylvania, SLF is also found

in New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Connecticut, Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, and West Virginia.

The Spotted Lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula, an invasive planthopper (a type of insect) native to certain parts of Southeast Asia. It was first found in the U.S. in Berks County, Pennsylvania in 2014. The lanternfly has a preferred host—Tree of Heaven (Ailanthus altissima.) This weedy invasive tree was imported to the US in 1784. The lanternfly is a new import, but it found a familiar host widely distributed in the U.S.

The lanternfly does not limit its feeding to Tree of Heaven. It will also feed on more than 70 other plant species, including grapes, hops, and fruit trees. According to the PA Department of Agriculture: "This pest poses a significant threat to the state's more than \$28 million grape, \$87 million apple, and more than \$19 million peach industries, as well as Pennsylvania's \$39 billion hardwood industry." It also poses a real threat to the hardwood trees that dominate Beech Mountain Lakes. In other words this insect poses a real threat to our development.

Lanternflies do not eat leaves. They pierce the bark of woody plants and suck out nutrients from the vascular tissue. That means that arial spraying will not be effective in controlling SLF. Trees are rarely killed by lanternflies, but are weakened and made more susceptible to other diseases and drought. The lanternfly's excrement is liquid.

When it lands on your roof, deck, outdoor furniture, automobiles driveway and children's toys it creates a slimy black mold. This mold is very difficult to remove.

Adult lanternflies can fly, but it may be the least mobile of their life history stages—their egg masses—have the greatest potential for long-distance travel. Lanternfly egg masses are inconspicuous, and females will lay them on virtually any surface: trees, lumber, yard furniture, vehicles. Female lanternflies that are ready to lay eggs tend to be lazy, dropping onto the nearest convenient surface and depositing roughly 30 to 50 eggs.

In July the 1/4 inch black and white larva develop into a larger 1 inch black and red insect with white spots. This rather quickly develops into the winged adult. Unlike gypsy moth adults, all stages of lanternflies feed on living plants. When adults mature they mate and females lay their eggs in masses.

The young larvae are too small to be noticed. The adult (shown at left) is approximately 1" long and 1/2" wide at rest. Adults are most frequently seen at rest as in the bottom photo.

WHAT CAN I DO?

Containing and eradicating the spotted lanternfly is probably impossible. However its spread can be limited. It is very important that ordinary citizens inform themselves about this pest. Spotted lanternflies are usually easy to identify.



If you visit an area where this insect is prevalent it is important that you inspect your vehicles, camping equipment, or boats for adults or egg masses. Be careful that you do not bring these critters home with you.

If you see one of these bugs here in beech mountain kill it! Inform your neighbors to be on the look out.
