GARDENING CORNER



TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

July is a busy month for Beech Mountain gardeners. The end of June brought flooding rains, and smoke filled skies. While neither of these conditions are predictable, we can hope that the weather is kinder the rest of summer.

This month we will revisit some information on a persistent weed that continues to plague our development.

DEALING WITH STILTGRASS

Japanese stiltgrass is an invasive weed that threatens native plants in Beech Mountain and all of the eastern United States. Native to Asia, stiltgrass was originally documented in Tennessee in 1919.

Stiltgrass is an annual grass that germinates in the spring, grows to heights of 2 to 3½ feet, and dies back in the fall. In August through early-October, the plants generate slender flower spikes. Each plant can produce up to 1,000 seeds. Once in the soil, seeds can remain viable for up to 5 years.

The seeds are small and easily adhere to clothing, shoes and animal fur, which aid the spread of stiltgrass along woodland pathways, lawns and gardens. Once established, stiltgrass may impact surrounding plants by increasing shade. Left unchecked, native vegetation in susceptible areas can be overtaken in three to five years.

In Beech Mountain, stiltgrass is most abundant along swales and in wooded areas, but it can be found almost everywhere.

For homeowners this weed can become a problem in lawns, landscaped areas and gardens.



Controlling this weed will be a problem facing homeowners in Beech Mountain for many years. It will not be possible to eliminate this pest, but it can be controlled. Control of stiltgrass will require persistent work by homeowners.

- In early spring it is possible to prevent the sprouting of Stiltgrass seed through the use of pre-emergent herbicide like Preen. Pre-emergents will not harm perennials so they are safe for use around trees and shrubs. However, they must be applied before the seed germinate. Once the seeds sprout, pre-emergents will not work.
- In the summer, once the seeds have sprouted, Stilt grass can be mechanically controlled by hand pulling the plants. However this tends to disturb the soil and encourages sprouting of seeds still in the ground. Chemical control is possible through the use of broad spectrum herbicides like glyphosate (Roundup®) However, this herbicide will destroy most plants and must be used with care to protect non target plants.
- Stilt grass growing in lawns and landscape beds can be chemically controlled using Fenoxaprop-p-ethyl (a selective herbicide.) It is a slow acting herbicide, and most effective control is on young plants. It also works against crabgrass.
- By September some plants in Beech mountain are already producing seeds. Herbicides are useless at this point as the plants will mature and produce seeds before the herbicide has a chance to work.
- If the plants in your area have not yet gone to seed hand pulling the plants or attacking them with a string trimmer will prevent flowering and seed production, and the plants will not have time to produce new shoots and flowers before frost. That will dramatically reduce the number of seeds to germinate next spring.



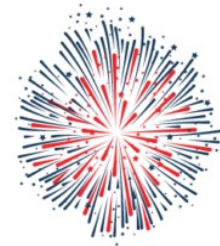

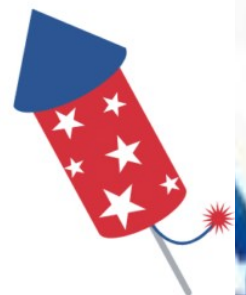
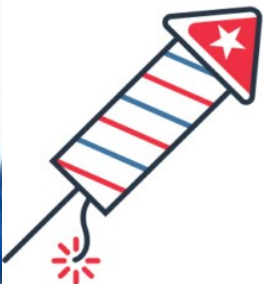
