- 2022 Membership Card, Beach Tag or QH Card is required to use the beach. You must show one of those when asked by a Beech Mountain Lakes Staff Member or Security.
- No Drugs or Alcohol allowed on the beach
- No dogs or any other household pets are allowed on the beach or in the swim area.
- Proper swim attire is required. This is a family friendly beach.
- No fishing in the swimming area.
- No boats in the swimming area.
- Children under 14 must have an adult present.
- Smoking only allowed in designated smoking areas.
- No Glass Bottles
- Docks are for assigned boat owners only. No jumping or swimming from the docks.

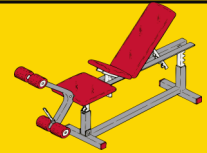

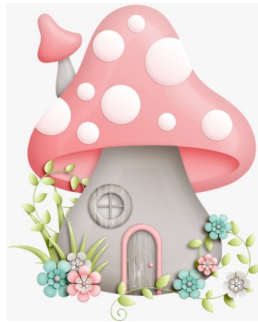

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

Summer has finally arrived. It is a great time of year for gardeners in Beech Mountain. There is a lot of work in the garden that will pay big dividends later in the season.

There are lots of near by nurseries and flower tents providing a wide variety of colorful annuals. Select healthy seedlings and plant them as quickly as you can. Check labels for required growing conditions, mature size and spacing.

When choosing plants for your 2022 garden, consider these Penn State Flower Trials standouts. Penn State Flower Trials are headquartered at the Southeast Agricultural and Research Center (SEAREC) in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Various horticultural breeders send their plants to SEAREC to be grown and evaluated. Flower Trial staff grow the plants under standardized conditions, rate their performance, and provide tours and information for gardeners.

The plants discussed here were grown as annuals. They are "Best in Show" from the 2021 Penn State Flower Trials at SEAREC and are all available for purchase online. Coleus (Solenostemon) **'Copperhead'**

New varieties of coleus have such exciting foliage that they vie with annuals that sport showy flowers. 'Copperhead' has ruffled and serrated burgundy leaves edged with lime.

At 23 inches high by 29 inches wide, 'Copperhead' will fill a large container.



Cuphea 'Honeybells' Ball Floraplant®

Many gardeners may not be familiar with *Cuphea*, which has bell-shaped flowers that attract hummingbirds. 'Honeybells' features abundant red and yellow bell-shaped flowers that bloom throughout the summer and do not require deadheading. Heat and drought-tolerant and 8 inches high with a trailing habit, 'Honeybells' is a good choice for balcony and patio containers. It thrives in full sun to part shade.



Impatiens x hybrida
SunPatiens® Compact 'Orchid Blush'
Sakata® Though your grandmother's *Impatiens* was destined for shady garden beds, recent offerings by breeders, such as SunPatiens®, thrive in full sun. SunPatiens® is recommended for any light level in the

garden. The lavender coloring of 'Orchid Blush' may lend a tropical feel to your landscape. At 16 inches in height and 25 inches wide, 'Orchid Blush' makes an excellent bedding plant.

Scaevola Surdiva® 'White Improved' **Suntory Flowers**

Also known as fan flower, *Scaevola aemula* is native to Australia and is a relative newcomer to the gardens in the United States. The abundant flowers of *Scaevola Surdiva® 'White Improved'* resemble tiny fans. They will keep going, even during the hottest days of summer.

'White Improved' is 11 inches high and 24 inches wide and should be grown in full sun. It is compact and semi-trailing, making it a good choice for window boxes or landscape beds.



Calibrachoa Bloomtastic 'Yellow' Dümnen **Orange™**

Though not quite a "Best in Show," this *Calibrachoa* received a 4.91 out of 5 rating. Since Penn State's Flower Trials boast an abundance of *Calibrachoa*, I decided to include this highly rated offering. Sometimes called million bells or "calis,"

Calibrachoa resemble small petunias. Bloomtastic 'Yellow' is a cheerful, pure yellow and grows 10 inches high by 28 inches wide.
