SECRETARY'S REPORT: The January 29,2020 Board Executive Session minutes were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Financials for January were reviewed but not approved. They cannot be approved until after the audit is completed.

LEGAL REPORT: No report.

QUAIL ROLLOW REPORT: No report.

MANAGER REPORTS: Karen Amici read the Maintenance, Recreation and ACC, CEO &

ROVING reports.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee did not meet in February. They are planning plant sales for Easter and Mother's Day. FINANCE COMMITTEE: Dave Davis reported that the Finance Committee met in February and reviewed the December and January pre-audit financials. The Committee will be assisting in reviewing the Capital Improvement projects.

#### OWNER COMMENTS:

Jim Gurzler, Board President, stated he will be having a 'Coffee With The Board President" on the 2<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month in the Community Room. Details to follow. The Air Exchange/Dehumidification system needs to be replaced in the pool area at a cost is in the \$90-\$100k range. The hot tub also needs to be replaced at a minimum cost of \$18k. A resident commented on abandoned vehicles hidden in the Bear Run, Buck Saw and Buck Ridge Dr. areas. The CEO officer will be sent up to the areas. An owner commented about wasps in the gym. Seitz Bros. has been here 2x in the same week to address the problem. An owner commented about the condition of the Four Seasons/Trapper Springs Ln intersection road. An owner asked if information can be put into the newsletter about emergency situations. Better signs are needed as well. An owner asked if BINGO is coming back- yes in May. An owner commented that they have recently patronized the Restaurant and were very pleased with the experience. An owner commented on the condition of Beaver Slide Dr. - it will be done as part of the paving project once AQUA is finished replacing the mainline. An owner asked when will AQUA finish the work on Trapper Spring Circle that has not been done for the past few years. Admin will followup with AQUA. An owner commented that they got a very good price on Propane from Modern Gas.





#### TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

#### **HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!**

We have been on a rollercoaster ride weather- wise this winter. Record highs followed by record lows have kept us guessing about what's next. Even though we have experienced some almost summer-like weather, we can still expect snow and cold weather. So don't start planting yet!

#### **Winter Chores**

There is still time to tackle some of those winter gardening chores. March is a good time to prune trees and shrubs. Of course avoid pruning those early blooming shrubs like rhododendron or forsythia. If you have knockout roses they should pe pruned back after the last hard frost. Knockouts will grow back vigorously in time for blooming.

If you are not sure of what to prune or how to prune, I recommend that you check a comprehensive pruning guide from the University of Minnesota titled "Pruning Trees and Shrubs." It provides detailed information on how, when, and what to prune. You can find it online at;

#### **SPRING INTO GARDENING**



Luzerne County Master Gardeners have some inspiration for area gardeners at their annual SPRING INTO GARDENING program. The event will be held on Saturday, April 25th at Penn State Wilkes-Barre Campus in Lehman. This year SIG will offer seven different workshops

including the keynote presentation by Scott Guiser, retired Penn State Horticulturist and Educator. Scotts topic is "What Killed that tree," a look at common causes of tree mortality.

With increasingly warm winters Northeastern PA has experienced an increase in the occurrence of ticks.

Michelle Cassetori, VP Director of Education and Outreach, Pennsylvania

Lyme Research Network will offer *Dare 2B*Tick Aware a report on the latest research on ticks and the diseases they transmit.



With increasing interest in growing berries in Northeast PA, Scott Guiser will present a discussion of growing berries in

the home garden Grow your Berry Best.

Penn State master Gardener, Mary Ann Miller will present *Gardening in a Changing Climate*. Tips and tricks for home gardeners to recognize changes in seasonal weather and how to manage them.

The Spotted Lanternfly has been spotted in Luzerne County and is well established in Schuylkill County. Dave Orbin, Penn State

Master Gardener, will give an update on the nature of this exotic pest, its rapid spread, and things homeowners and gardeners can do to combat the pest.

While gardening ia a life-long hobby, senior gardeners face new challenges as the grow older.

Susan Kennedy, Penn State Master Gardener will offer The Aging Gardner, a discussion of adaptations that gardeners can make to allow them to continue to grow the best gardens possible. She will discuss tools and techniques for gardening with physical limitations.

Most gardeners have limited knowledge about the primarily limiting factor in their home gardens, the soil. Krystal Snider a Penn State Commercial Horticulture Educator will present *Know Your Soils* an easy to understand discussion on the topic of garden soils.

A highlight of SIG is the plant sale. A wide selection of perennials and annuals will be available for purchase. Master Gardeners will be available all day to answer your gardening questions. Spring into Gardening will begin at 8:30 AM, and conclude at 1:00 PM. The half-day program costs \$25.
