#### **Hello Beech Mountain Gardeners!**

Are you ready for spring? March gave us a few hints of spring and a few reminders that winter isn't quite ready to give up. April promises warmer days, but don't get ahead of the calendar with planting annual flowers and veggies. Most annuals require warmer soil temperatures so early planting does not give them a head start, and risks damage in late frosts.

#### **SOIL TESTS**

Soil testing is one of the most important investments you can make in your landscape. Whether it is for your turf lawn your perennial beds or a vegetable garden. This is an ideal time to get your soil tested through Penn State's Soil Test Laboratory.

Each sample is analyzed for pH, lime requirement, and for phosphorus, potassium, magnesium, and calcium. The final report includes the chemical analysis of the soil along with lime and fertilizer recommendations for the crop specified.


Soil testing through Penn State's Soils Lab cost just \$9.00, a small investment when fertilizers can cost up to \$40 per bag. Applying fertilizer without a soil test is like taking drugs without a prescription, a waste of money and dangerous to your lawn and garden.

Soil test kits are currently difficult to find because of Covid related closures of Penn State's Extension Offices. However you can construct your own test kit using the information available online at agsci.psu.edu/aasl/soil-testing/fertility.

Instructions on how to collect a sample along with forms for submitting the sample are available at the above link.

You can place your sample in a sturdy Ziplock bag. Then place it along with the submission form and your check for \$9.00 in a padded mailing envelope like the ones Amazon sends small packages in. The mailing address is provided on the submission form.

#### **Tree Trunks**



One quick test of any tree's root depth is to check its trunk for root flair. Trees growing at the right depth display a flair at the base of the trunk. A tree that resembles a phone pole growing straight out of the soil is planted too deeply.

Root flair covered with soil or mulch will stay moist encouraging bark devouring pests and disease organisms. Ground covers that grow against the base of a tree can also cause damage. Keep the root flair bare and open to light and air.

In addition all trees are affected by mechanical damage. Be sure to keep your mower and string trimmer away from the trunk of your trees.

#### **IN Praise of Daffodils**

Anyone living in Beech Mountain must notice the abundance of daffodils throughout the development and the scarcity of other spring flowers like tulips and crocus. Daffodils dominate our spring landscape because of natural selection.

The selecting force is our ever present deer that ignore daffodils while eating other spring flowering bulbs. Deer, rabbits, groundhogs and other small rodents ignore daffodils because they contain poisonous compounds including lycorine.

Daffodils are reliable perennials that will grow and multiply for many years with minimal care. Daffodils prefer growing in full sun, but can tolerate quite a bit of shade. Be sure to allow the leaves of your daffodils to grow undisturbed until they die back in early summer. Apply a little fertilizer after the daffodils bloom, about a table-spoon of 0-10-10 or 0-0-50 fertilizer sprinkled around the base of the plants should take care of that need. Do not over fertilize and avoid nitrogen rich fertilizers.
