#### TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS



#### HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

May is a busy month in the garden with much to do and enjoy. This time of year is great for landscape planting and this column will focus on some plants suitable for growing in our development.

## CHOOSING THE RIGHT PLANT FOR YOUR LANDSCAPE

May is a big month for garden centers and the selection of suitable plants is at its best. Beech Mountain gardeners should plan carefully before selecting plants for inclusion in the landscape.

As you know, deer will eat many different plants, and seem to enjoy expensive, carefully selected, trees & shrubs. Be aware that deer will try any new plant presented in the area.

So it is a good idea to protect newly planted trees or shrubs. The best protection is a temporary fence that surrounds the new plant and covers the top as well.

There are some shrubs and trees that should be avoided unless you just want to feed the deer. Hint: there are cheaper forms of deer food. At the top of the deer food list is the landscaper's stand-by, Arborvitae, Thuja occidentalis (the tall columnar evergreen.) This year you can recognize these in the development because they are brown from the ground up to about 5 feet. Arborvitae shorter than 5 feet have no green left at all this

Among ground covers avoid Hostas, another favorite of the deer.

should also be avoided (with one exception.)

spring. Of course hybrid rhododendron and azalea

There are some evergreens that the deer tend to avoid. Hemlock Tsuga Canadensis, is Pennsylvania's state tree, and a great native plant avoided by deer. It can be pruned to control size. There are however, a couple of serious insect pests of hemlock, the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, and Elongate Hemlock Scale. Both of these are native to Asia and have no natural predators in the U.S. These

predators can be controlled with appropriate insecticides. If you have hemlock on your property be on the lookout for these pests and take steps to control them.

One good standby deer resistant evergreen is Juniper, Juniperus chinensis. There are upright and spreading varieties. They can make excellent land-scape plants, and can be kept at a reasonable size with annual pruning. There are many varieties of Junipers with different characteristics, and you should do some research on any variety before you make a purchase. Most Junipers prefer full sun. while they can grow in part shade they will not do well without lots of sun.

Dwarf Alberta Spruce, Picea glauca 'Conica', is another deer resistant plant. They are small, slow growing conical trees that maintain their "Christmas Tree" shape with little or no pruning. While these are often planted in symmetrical groupings, they rarely grow at the same rate and should be planted in asymmetrical groupings. These trees grow slowly, but can reach 10 to 12 feet in 25 years. They should be planted at least 8 feet apart.

Boxwood is a broadleaf evergreen shrub that is

reliably deer resistant. It is a relative slow grower, and can be sheared for those who like geometrically shaped shrubs, or hand pruned for a more natural look. Boxwood requires little care.

One semi-reliable rhododendron variety is Rhododendron 'PJM'
Hybrids. This is a smaller leafed rhododendron with smaller flowers. Deer will sometimes chew on

this plant but rarely destroy it.

Omamental grasses make excellent deer resistant landscape plants, These can make a bold statement in your landscape and give fall color as well. Most omamental grasses prefer full sun and will not do well in shade.

If you are looking for deer resistant groundcover Pachysandra, *Pachysandra terminalis* is a good choice. It will do well in shade and spread.
