CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were: Kevin Walsh, Jim Gurzler, Lena Fowler & Karen Trublea. Bryan Chittester participated via conference call. Atty. Joseph Baranko & General Manager, Robert Rosner were also present.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The September 2019 Executive & Open Session minutes were approved. BOARD ELECTION RESULT: Linda Jo Robbins won the election with 78 votes. Congratulations! TREASURER'S REPORT: The Financials for August 2019 & September 2019 were approved. Dave Davis explained the change in having Finance Committee Mtgs after the financials are approved.

LEGAL REPORT: No report.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: QHV reported that they received the Resort Hospitality Award from RCI.

MANAGER REPORTS: Robert Rosner read the GM and the Maintenance report.

RECREATION REPORT: Karen Amici read the Recreation Dept. report.

ACC, CEO & ROVING REPORT: Karen Amici read the ACC, CEO & ROVING report.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee is planning Christmas Season activities. The Committee would also like to have a Christmas Party. Details to follow. Gene Manning of he Perks Committee provided a recap of the Fall Festival.

EAP COMMITTEE: Karen Amici will be attending a required DEP class in November which was previously scheduled for October to move this process forward.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: The Committee has begun reviewing the policies and practices of the Association documented on the website. Administration will review the policies and will update the website where warranted.

OWNER COMMENTS:

An owner asked where the ice machine is now located. It has been moved off of the deck entering Rec. An owner asked about the status of the water extraction facility. The SRBC, Butler Twp, Deep Woods Lake & BML are going to meet to discuss. An owner stated he attended one of the earlier meetings, and the SRBC would not commit to the question of who has water priority. An owner asked if there will be a monitor on the well to determine if the water levels are getting low. Also, the owners are concerned about noise and truck traffic and the condition of Honey Hole Rd. emergency road. The Board revealed the proposed 2020 budget to the ownership. There will be a \$20 reduction in dues and a \$20 increase for garbage fees. The \$20 increase in garbage does continue recycling. The budgeted loss in the Restaurant is estimated at \$17K for 2020. An owner asked if the Finance Cmte is involved in the budget process. No, the Finance Cmte reviews the monthly financials and asks questions of the Board/Administration. An owner asked if a safety handrail could be put in the hot tub area. The GM will investigate. An owner commented that shades are needed in the Restaurant to block out the sunlight. An owner asked if Watch For Deer signs can be put up in the community. An owner commented that the Fall Festival was excellent! An owner asked what happened to the \$5K Sports Club money? The Board designated ½ to the 2019 Fishing Derby and the Board designated ½ to the 2020 Fishing Derby. An owner commented about the dry dock boat stickers. Karen Amici replied. An owner asked if we could purchase/rent a leaf vacuum. The Board indicated that purchase is cost prohibitive. The GM will look into a rental. An owner commented about a vehicle passing through 2 school buses with their lights flashing. Admin has the information and will issue a citation. An owner asked when the paving will be done. The GM responded it should be done in the next week or two. An owner asked about the AQUA markings on Trapper Spring Circle. The GM will investigate. An owner asked if the pot holes in the roads will be patched before the winter. Yes, they will be patched. An owner asked about renting rooms in a property in BML or part of a property. Only an entire residence can be rented out, not any portion of a residence. All seasonal and annual rentals are registered with the Administration Office. An owner inquired about bands in the Restaurant and staffing.





TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS



HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

We are in the midst of fall leaf season here and we are all keeping busy with the annual clean-up. This month we will look at a great escape from fall chores.

Beech Mountain is only a two hour drive away from one of the finest horticultural display gardens in the United States. Longwood Gardens is open year round but the fall and Holiday Season is an especially good time to visit.

LONGWOOD

Longwood Gardens is a treasured American botanical garden consisting of over 1,077 acres of gardens, woodlands, and meadows in Kennett Square, Pennsylvania, It is one of the premier horticultural display gardens in the United States and is open to visitors year-round to enjoy native and exotic plants and horticulture (both indoor and outdoor), events and performances, seasonal and themed attractions, as well as educational lectures, and workshops.



In 1700, a Quaker farmer named George Peirce purchased 402 acres of this English-claimed land from William Penn's commissioners. George's son Joshua cleared and farmed the land and in 1730 he built the brick farmhouse that, enlarged, still stands today.

On July 20, 1906, 36-year-old Pierre S. du Pont purchased the farm primarily to preserve the trees. He wasn't planning to create Longwood Gardens, but within a few years, his desire to make it a place where he could entertain his friends transformed a simple country farm into one of the country's leading horticultural display gardens.

Today the Longwood Gardens consists of varied outdoor gardens, ranging from formal to naturalistic in their landscape design, and 20 indoor gardens within a 4.5-acre group of heated greenhouses. Longwood's Conservatory contains 4,600 different types of plants and trees, as well

as fountains. It hosts hundreds of horticultural and performing arts events each year, from flower shows, gardening demonstrations, courses, and children's programs to concerts, organ and carillon recitals, fountain shows, and fireworks displays. It also hosts an extensive Christmas light display during the holiday season. The Gardens have attracted more than 1 million visitors a year since 2012.



Beginning Nov. 22 and continuing until Jan. 5, 2020, Longwood will be decorated for the Holidays. Expect to see hundreds of lighted trees, inside and out, Poinsettia varieties in every size, shape, and color. You'll see an an amazing orchid display with hundreds of orchids in bloom.

There's a 10,010-pipe organ that's working overtime

through the holidays. And if you're lucky, you'll make it to the Ballroom in time to partake in one of the daily holiday singalongs.



There is an outdoor garden railroad and a shimmering tunnel of lights. The fountains are all dressed up, too. Every five minutes, the Open Air Theatre Fountains come alive with 750 jets sputtering illuminated water streams choreographed to music. This is an exciting adventure for the whole family. 
