CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were: Kevin Walsh, Jim Gurzler, Linda Jo Robbins in person. Kevin Ferra and Lena Fowler participated via conference call. Jake Meyer was absent.

Atty.Baranko and General Manager Edward Florentino were also present.

BOARD OF DIRECTOR ELECTION RESULTS: David Davis and Kevin Schuetrumpf were elected to the Board of Directors. Congratulations!

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The October 30, 2019 Annual Meeting minutes were approved. The September 30, 2020 Board Executive & Open Session minutes were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Board approved the December 2019- August 2020 financials. The Board is reviewing the September 2020 financials.

LEGAL REPORT: No report.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: No report.

MANAGER REPORTS: Ed Florentino read the GM report. Karen Amici read the Maintenance, Recreation and ACC, CEO & ROVING reports.

VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE: The Volunteer Committee is sponsoring a basket & wreath raffle and sponsored a scarecrow decorating contest. Decorative valances will be going up in the bar.

EAP COMMITTEE: No report.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: Chris Blazic indicated that the Committee is meeting with the board again on 11/9. The Committee has reviewed 17 policies and 5 have been approved. 6 policies are awaiting approval.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Dave Davis reported that the Finance Committee has submitted their 2021 budget and capital project recommendations.

OWNER COMMENTS:

The Board is reviewing the audit currently. An owner asked when will the political signs be coming down. Also, ads for contractor work done at homes as well. The GM will put out a communication. An owner commented that the stop sign on Lisa Lake Ct. is on the left side of the road- it should be on the right side. An owner commented that a contractor is marking the sewer lines in BML. The GM will investigate. An owner asked if AQUA will be doing mainline replacement on Trapper Springs Circle in 2021. As of now, AQUA does not have any mainline replacement work scheduled for 2021.

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

The end of October brought the end of the growing season and the beginning of the annual chore of leaf management in Beech Mountain. The lack of gypsy moths and the warm weather this summer seems to have been ideal for our trees. Leaf size and number is the largest I have seen here in the development in more than ten years. I believe the volume of leaves is greater than ever, even though there are fewer trees. Because of that I will devote this months column to repeating information previously published on handling leaves.

DEALING WITH LEAVES

This is a chore that affects everyone in Beech Mountain. We can just ignore them. After all, no one rakes the leaves in the forest. However, some unmanaged leaves can prove a hazard as dry leaves can burn, and wet leaves can be a slippery menace that can lead to falls and sliding vehicles. Leaves left in gutters can lead to clogging, and ice damage to roofs. Matted leaves left on lawns can kill turf grasses over the winter.

We have to recognize that no matter how thorough we are with collecting and disposing of leaves, they will keep falling, and blowing around all winter. So relax, complete leaf clean-up is not possible, and not necessary.

Our trash collection system in Beech Mountain presents a



challenge in leaf disposal. While the previous hauler would remove seemingly unlimited amounts of leaves, our current hauler will not pick up bags of leaves. Thus we have to find new

ways of disposing of fall leaves. And frankly burning tons of leaves in over crowded landfills does not make environmental sense.

Many gardeners have been using strategies to limit leaf disposal in the past, and I will suggest some strategies That can help.

Reduce the volume of leaves. One of the best way of dealing with the fallen leaves is to grind them up and use them as mulch. Leaves can be ground up in a leaf shredder, but a rotary lawn mower can also be a good leaf shredder. The next issue is what to do with the shredded leaves. You can compost them but that will require sufficient quantities of green material like lawn clippings and vegetable waste from the kitchen to complete the process.

Shredded leaves make an excellent and free mulch. Oak leaves are very slow to break down so they make a mulch that will last throughout the winter and even through next summer. Leaf mulch helps protect your trees and shrubs by stabilizing soil temperatures, and slowing evaporation of water from the soil. Since stressed plants are more prone to disease and insect damage, using mulch can reduce the need for insecticides and fungicides. A good layer of mulch will also suppress weed growth and reduce the amount of time you need to spend

growth and reduce the amount of time you need to spend weeding or applying herbicides.

Several inches of shredded leaves will keep the ground moist, and protect plants from frequent freeze/thaw cycles.

Leaves shredded with a mower can be left on the lawn. They will decompose through the winter and add organic material to your lawn soil. Just make sure you make several passes over the leaves to grind them into pieces no larger than a quarter.

BEECH MOUNTAIN COMPOST SITE

If you have no place to dump leaves on your property, BMLA has developed a composting area near the campground by the salt shed. To make this effort successful residents are asked to follow some simple rules.

- If possible shred leaves. Shredded leaves break down faster, and reduce the size of the pile.
- If you bring leaves to the compost site in containers or bags, please dump the leaves and take your containers home to reuse.
- Please bring nothing but leaves to the site; no branches, trees, or garbage. There is a garbage container there for empty bags only.

If everyone cooperates we will have a successful compost site _____


