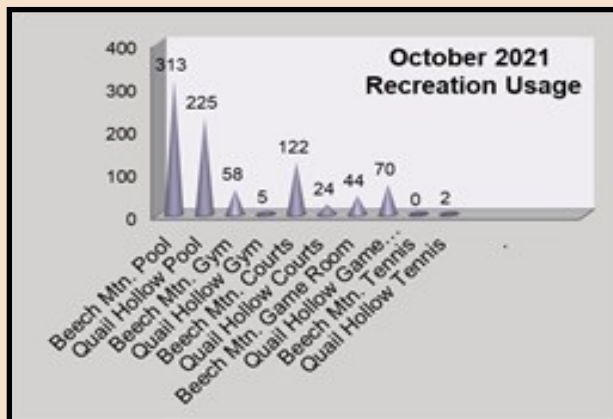

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

November is a time to put the garden to bed and complete those fall chores. Leaves are always available in plentiful supply here in Beech Mountain. Typically more abundant than most of us would prefer. Like the potato chip ad, Mother Nature says, "Go ahead rake them all up, I'll make more."

DEALING WITH LEAVES

Consider placing those leaves under shrubs as a winter mulch. The mulching will be more effective if the leaves are shredded. If you do not have access to a shredder you can run over the leaves with a lawn mower to grind them up.

Leaves that fall on your lawn can be shredded with your mower and left to add nutrients to the soil. You may want to place a final application of lawn fertilizer on your lawn after shredding the leaves. This will help with the decomposition of the shredded leaves.

Finally if you have too many leaves they can be taken to the Beech Mountain leaf pile near the camp ground. Please remember, this pile is for leaves only. Do not use this area for disposing of tree branches or other yard waste. Leaves should be dumped out of bags and the bags removed. You can dispose of the bags in your regular trash.

ACORNS

The great supply of acorns this fall means more clean-up for residents, but it also mean a great food crop for our deer herd. Did you know that acorns are the most preferred autumn food for deer?

FALL GARDEN CHORES

Planting Bulbs: You need to get those spring bulbs in the ground soon before the ground freezes. Choose bulbs that are firm: avoid any that show bruises or are beginning to mold.

Squeeze the bulb gently to be sure that the bulb has not begun to dry out in the skin.

The larger size bulbs will result in a larger, better quality plant, since the first years' nutrients are all contained within the bulb. Tulips are a prime food for deer. If you aren't planting just to feed the deer, select daffodils or hyacinths.

Trenching or digging out the entire bed is usually easier than using a bulb planter. If you are planting in a rocky area, you may want to have a bag of top soil to refill the planting holes. The most important consideration is drainage: bulbs are very prone to rot if too wet, drainage is key. If you have concerns place bulbs in raised bed. As a rule of thumb bulbs are planted about three times as deep as the bulb is wide.

Purchases from most reputable growers will come with specific planting instructions.. Spread fertilizer lightly over the planting bed.. Apply a 2 to 4 inch layer of light mulch such as shredded leaves to prevent spring frost & heave damage. Water the area thoroughly after planting.

Herbs: Some herbs can be dug up and brought in for the winter placed on a sunny window sill...they may not perform like they do in the garden but you will be delighted when you can pick parsley in December.

Roses: Stop deadheading and do not apply any fertilizer now. Check out those catalogs for next years choices..

Seasonal: Soil Test Kits are available from the Penn State Extension office for \$9.00. This is so darn easy! Fill the bag and send it off to Penn State and in a week or so you will have the correct information to amend your soil...what could be easier? You'll want to bump up your soil nutrient with leaves, compost or peat moss.

Now is a good time to clean your gardening tools for next season. Sharpen tools with cutting blades. Buff with steel wool or sandpaper and apply a light coat of oil. Drain the gasoline from your lawnmower, change the oil, and sharpen the blade. Store all your tools inside in a dry location.

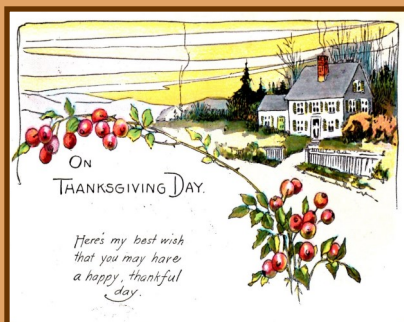
Good shepherd Church, Drums
