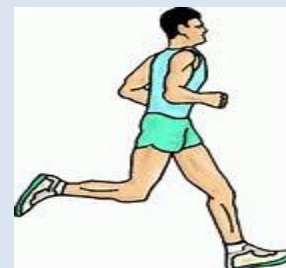

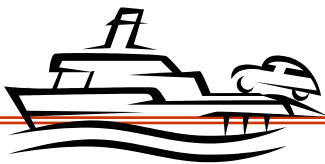

## GARDENING CORNER



### TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

#### HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

This month I want to share some information on a world class botanical garden located here in Eastern Pennsylvania just about 125 miles south of Beech Mountain.

**LONGWOOD GARDENS**, located in Kennet Square, PA, is one of America's quintessential landscapes, a place of ever-changing seasonal beauty, handcrafted feats of horticultural wonder, and an awe-inspiring collection of the most beautiful plants from around the globe.

From its humble beginnings as a Quaker farmstead and arboretum, to Pierre S. du Pont's forward-thinking stewardship, to today's collection of renowned landscape designers, horticulturists, and architects, this great garden of the world evolves and emerges again and again.

You can explore nearly 200 acres of lush, formal gardens, open meadows, and winding paths to breathtaking Brandywine Valley vistas. Together, mesmerizing displays, feats of engineering, and science-based research and conservation work harmoniously toward the overarching goal to unite and inspire the garden's guests in appreciation of beauty—as only Longwood can.

Today Longwood Gardens consists of varied outdoor gardens, ranging from formal to naturalistic in their landscape design, and 20 indoor gardens within a 4.5 acre of heat-



ed conservatories. Longwood's Conservatory contains 4,600 different types of plants and trees.

In addition there are three major fountain display and numerous water features both inside and outside. Over the next several months Longwood will showcase two of its most visited seasons. Beginning



on September 30 and continuing through November 12 the gardens will feature their Chrysanthemum Festival. From dancing fountains to the festive Pumpkin Playground to the whimsical Garden

Railway, fall fun takes many forms this season. Cherished for their exquisite beauty and delightfully distinct variations, chrysanthemums take center stage this season—and for very good reason. Complex by nature, chrysanthemums are divided into 13 classifications, each featuring a distinct flower form, from the tiny pompon to the great irregular

incurve—all on full, radiant display. When that complexity meets the horticultural artistry of the specialty forms in our grand Conservatory, the result is simply spectacular.

Beginning November 17 Longwood celebrates the holiday season with millions of lights, spectacular floral arrangements and music from Longwood's giant pipe organ.

If you visited Longwood in the past be prepared to see the new 250 million dollar conservatory currently under construction. If you have never been there I suggest that you do a search in YouTube for Longwood Gardens. There are numerous videos of Longwood in all its seasons. The videos will give you a much better idea of the beauty of this horticultural gem than can be seen in still photos.

Before you go, visit Longwoods web site for ticket information. Week days are less crowded.
