

TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN

GARDENERS!

Happy Fall! By the time you read this we will be looking at a new crop of those autumn leaves. Enjoy the color even if you hate the cleanup. This year I have been experiencing a bumper crop of acorns. It looks like at least twice what I had last year. That should keep our squirrels happy.

JUMPING WORMS?

Most gardeners are familiar with earthworms and see them as friends of the garden and pretty good fishing bait. The earth worms

we are familiar with were actually imported from Europe by early settlers. Our native worms were all wiped out in the last ice age.

As gardeners, we understand that earthworms are important allies in creating a soil ecosystem that is conducive to growing flowers, vegetables, turf, shrubs, trees or any type of plant. European earthworms such as common night crawlers create tunnels, which allow air and water to reach plant

roots. Their castings, or excrement, help enrich the soil by adding nutrients such as phosphorous, calcium, nitrogen, and magnesium.

Recently an invasive species of earthworm, the Asian Jumping worm (*Amynthas* spp.), also known as snake worms or crazy worms for their quick, crazed-like movement, have made their way into Beech Mountain and surrounding areas.

These invasive worms live in the organic matter in the topmost layer of soil. This upper layer of organic matter protects the soil from erosion. It is in this duff layer of the forest floor where many of the tree roots establish and wildflowers grow. Asian jumping worms are ravenous feeders and they quickly consume the organic matter and degrade the soil. Nutrients from their castings are rapidly released with a small amount actually reaching the roots of plants. During heavy rainstorms, the nutrients are quickly lost and the soil may be unable to support plant growth.

Where there was once lush vegetation and wildflowers, there is only bare soil. When such a disturbance happens, it provides an opportunity for an invasive plant species such as garlic mustard or stilt grass to move in. The structure of the soil is also damaged and often there will be voids under tree roots near the surface of the soil.

Asian jumping worms are an annual species—the adults die after the first freeze. The cocoons, which are about the size of a mustard seed, will survive the winter and hatch in mid-April after temperatures reach 50°F. One worm can produce many cocoons without mating.

How do you know if you have Asian earthworms?

One telltale sign of an infestation is the presence of golf ball size piles of black soil the color of coffee grounds created from worm castings, soil that the worms leave behind.

When you scratch the top layer of soil, you will see the worms thrashing about with an erratic, snakelike movement. You may notice these worms when you are raking leaves this fall. These worms, which can reach 6 inches in length, are much more active than European nightcrawlers. The photo shows about 50 worms I collected in 20 minutes raking acorns in my back yard.

If you examine a worm close-up, you will notice the prominent band around the body of the worm called the clitellum, where cocoons are produced. On a jumping worm, the band completely encircles the body, is milky white to light gray, and is flush with the body. On European nightcrawlers, the clitellum is raised and reddish-brown color and does not wrap entirely around the body

How did they get here?

Obviously worms cannot fly. They are most likely transported in soil, mulch or compost. In addition these worms may have been purchased as bait and discarded thinking that worms enrich the soil. You may have gotten some from plants that another gardener shared with you.

How can I control jumping worms?

Actually there is not much you can do at the moment. You can collect the worms and dump them in a bucket of hot water with detergent. You can then dispose of the worms in the garbage. Do not throw live worms in your compost pile or discard them in the woods.

Select commercial compost or mulch that has been heat treated to 130 degrees. If you purchase topsoil make sure that the source is free of worms.

Research is currently being conducted at major Land-grant Universities to find means of controlling these worms. In the meantime keep looking for these worms on your property. Destroy any worms you may find. Look here for updates on control methods.


