
















Volunteer/Recreation Committee Happenings This Month

Gardening Corner



TIPS FROM **PENN STATE** MASTER **GARDENERS**

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

October means lots and lots of leaves to rake. I hope you will consider composting this year. It does not make sense have leaves hauled to a land fill when they can be composted and recycled in the woods where they were produced. Don't forget to get those spring bulbs planted this month. They can be planted up until the ground freezes, but the sooner they are planted the better they will do in the spring.

CONTROLLING GOUTWEED

In last month's column I said the I would provide some A FALL GARDEN CHORE CHECKLIST information on how to control Goutweed. The problem with this weed is that it is very resistant to non chemical means of control. If your infestation of Goutweed is not within a bed of another ground cover plant, the most effective treatment is to spray the plant with glyphosate (Roundup®). You must remember that glyphosate must be • sprayed on the leaves. It then is transported to the roots where it kills the plant and underground rhizomes. It will take a few weeks to kill the plants. The weeds must have leaves that are intact and still active. It is probably too late to spray this

If your Goutweed is among other ground cover plants You can treat the weed by applying glyphosate with an envelope dauber without killing the other plants.

SHREDDED LEAVES MAKE AN EXCELLENT MULCH

Shredded leaves make an excellent mulch. Oak leaves are very slow to break down so they make a mulch that will last throughout the winter and even through next summer. Leaf mulch helps protect your trees and shrubs by stabilizing soil temperatures, and slowing evaporation of water from the soil.

This summer a lot of trees and shrubs were stressed by high temperatures and drought. Stressed plants are more prone to disease and insect damage. Using a good mulch can reduce the need for insecticides and fungicides.

A good layer of mulch will also suppress weed growth and reduce the amount of time you need to spend weeding or applying herbicides.

PLANTING BULBS

Choose bulbs that are firm: avoid any that show bruises or are beginning to mold. Squeeze the bulb gently to be sure that the bulb has not begun to dry out in the skin.

The larger size bulbs will result in a larger, better quality plant, since the first years' nutrients are all contained within the bulb. Tulips are a prime food for deer. If you aren't planting just to feed the deer, select daffodils or hyacinths.


The most important consideration is drainage: bulbs are very prone to rot if too wet, drainage is key...if you have concerns place bulbs in raised beds. As a rule of thumb bulbs are planted about three times as deep as the bulb is wide. Purchases from most reputable growers will come with specific planting instructions. Spread fertilizer lightly over the planting bed. Apply a 2 to 4 inch layer of light mulch such as straw or shredded leaves to prevent spring frost & heave damage. Water the area thoroughly after planting.

- Fertilize lawns to encourage vigorous root growth.
- Remove leaves from lawns or mow them with a mulching mower to prevent them from smothering the grass.
- Plant deciduous trees, shrubs and perennial flowers. Water well, and mulch for protection from the alternate freezes and thaws of winter.
 - Continue to control weeds into the fall to prevent them from releasing seeds for spring germination.
 - Shred and save leaves for use as mulch or to add to compost throughout the year.
- Divide overcrowded perennials such as Asiatic lilies, bearded iris, and peonies.
- Clean up flower beds. Remove spent annuals, cut back most perennials, and dispose of any diseased or insectinfested plant debris.
- Lift and store cold-sensitive bulbs like cannas, dahlias, and gladioli.
- Delay cutting back perennials like purple cone flowers which provide food for wildlife, or those that provide visual interest during the drab winter months.
- Plant spring flowering bulbs such as crocus, daffodils, tulips and hyacinth.
