## September General Managers Report 2015

1. The first proposed budget has been given to the Board of Directors for review. The budget will be discussed over the next month until the final budget is passed at the November Board Meeting. The October board meeting which is Oct 28<sup>th</sup> is the Associations Annual meeting.
2. The Dock Doctor has been scheduled to remove the docks during the last week in October. This will give everyone plenty of time to remove their boats. All boats must be off of the Lake by October 25<sup>th</sup>.
3. The sports club will be holding its annual fall festival down at the campground on October 3<sup>rd</sup> from 1pm – 4pm. There will be free hay rides to the pumpkin patch where children can pick out their own free pumpkin. There will be games with prizes, a bounce house, food and beverage. Watch the newsletter for more information. The campground will be closing down on October 25<sup>th</sup> 2014, so we are able to winterize the building and all of the camp sites. The paved road into the campground will be closed for the winter.
4. The Pavilion has been closed as of September 27<sup>th</sup> so we are able to clean up and move the tables to make room for the winter boat storage.
5. The kid's community Trick or Treat day will be on October 24<sup>th</sup> from 1 - 3PM. The Halloween costume parade will be held the same day at the clubhouse from 3:30 – 4:30PM. Watch the newsletter for all of the details.
6. The adult Halloween party in the restaurant/bar is scheduled for October 30<sup>th</sup> @ 9:00 PM. Kartune will be the entertainment for this event. We encourage residents to dress up in costumes. We will have cash prizes for our costume contest. The sports club will be auctioning off baskets of cheer
7. The restaurant will be holding Oktoberfest all month long every Friday & Saturday in the month of October. There will be special Oktoberfest food features and drink specials all month. Check the newsletter for more information.

10. All residents are responsible for cleaning and maintaining their swales and culvert pipes. Please make sure that your swales and culvert pipes are free of any leaves or debris before winter.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

The August 26, 2015 minutes were approved.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:**

The Financials for August were reviewed and approved. The Finance Committee did meet in September to review the financials.

**LEGAL REPORT:**

As of September 30, 2015, \$7,999.91 in dues and collections have been collected so far for the month of September. The amount of \$14,802.54 was collected in August.

**QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT:** Quail Hollow reported that they are developing a new marketing plan offering 1, 3 & 5 year ownership plans.

**MANAGER'S REPORT:** The General Manager read the GM report & Maintenance report. Karen Amici read the Recreation & ACC, CEO, Roving & Security reports.

**SPORTS CLUB:** The Sports Club is preparing for the upcoming fall festival on 10/10 from 1-4 pm in the campground. The club is also selling Basket Of Fear raffle tickets.

**LAKE COMMITTEE:** Mike Yatsko is now heading the Lake Committee. He wants to address rude conduct on the lake, safety of children while boating, lone swimmers with no spotter or marker. He would also like to see a Lake Captain and Code Enforcement on the lake. Trespassers also remain an issue which needs to be addressed.

**OWNER COMMENTS:**

An owner asked when the 2016 Budget proposal will be available for the owners to review. The Board indicated it will be available prior to the Annual Meeting on 10/28/15. An owner asked if there any policy regarding the use of the back beach. An owner asked when the pool roof will be finished and when the ½ of the exercise room will be fixed and available for use. The Board indicated that legal action against the prior roofing company is necessary. An owner inquired as to when the road paving on Edgerock is going to be done. AQUA is extending the project from Bear Run to Four Seasons. An owner asked about Halloween and improving the safety issues which occurred last year. An owner asked about when the entrance paving is going to be done to fix the high bump at the entrance. An owner gave a compliment to the restaurant & staff for a private get together held in the restaurant.

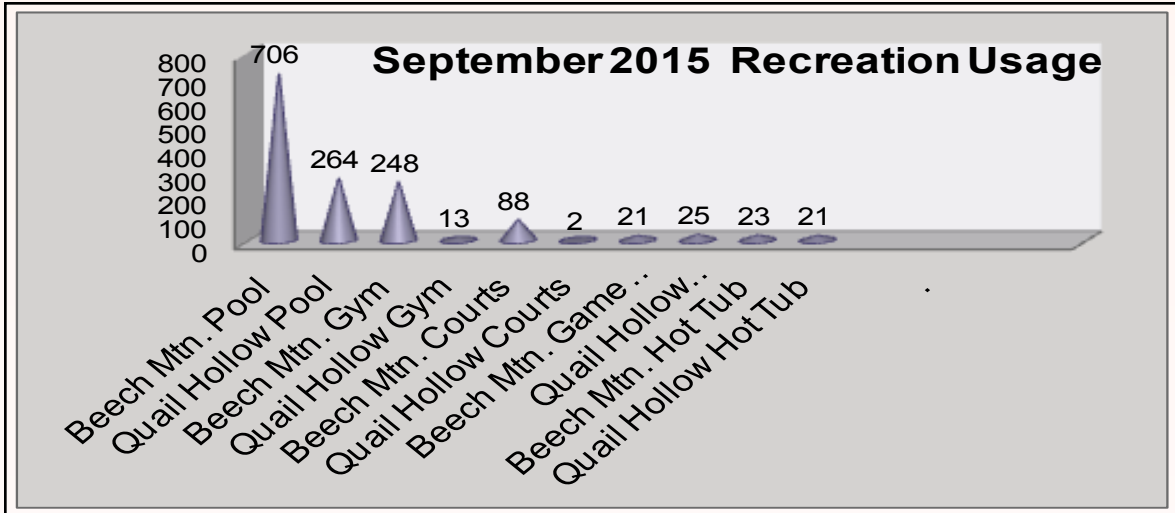

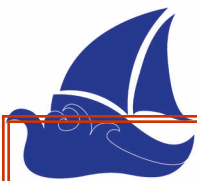

## GARDENING CORNER



## TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

### HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

We have just finished the warmest September on record, and one of the driest. While an extended summer is a thing of beauty this weather has taken its toll on our landscape. Trees and shrubs that are drought stressed are more susceptible to insect damage and disease.

### DON'T FORGET TO WATER

While we frequently think of watering lawns when they get brown, we tend to believe, incorrectly, that woody plants and non-woody perennials can take care of themselves. These plants need water. This is especially true of newly planted trees and shrubs. Trees and shrubs should receive the equivalent of 1 inch of water per week. During the first two years they are in the landscape. Trees and shrubs planted this season need to be thoroughly watered until the ground freezes.



### LEAVES, LEAVES, LEAVES

People travel to the Northeast United States each fall to see the display of color produced in our forests. We have a diverse forest here in Beech Mountain giving us the opportunity to enjoy a wide range of colors. However, October brings with it one of the biggest garden chores of the year, managing those fallen leaves.

We can just ignore them. After all, no one rakes the leaves in the forest. However, unmanaged

leaves can prove a hazard as dry leaves can burn, and wet leaves can be a slippery menace that can lead to falls and sliding vehicles. Leaves left in gutters can lead to clogging, and ice damage to roofs. Matted leaves left on lawns can kill turf grasses over the winter.

We all have to recognize that no matter how thorough we are with collecting and disposing of leaves, they will keep falling, and blowing around all winter. So relax, complete leaf cleanup is not possible, and not necessary.

As I have suggested in the past, one of the best way of dealing with the fallen leaves is to grind them up and use them as mulch. Leaves can be ground up in a leaf shredder, but a rotary lawn mower can also be a good leaf shredder. The next issue is what to do with the shredded leaves. You can compost them but that will require sufficient quantities of green material like lawn clippings and vegetable waste from the kitchen to complete the process.



Shredded leaves make an excellent mulch. Oak leaves are very slow to break down so they make a mulch that will last throughout the winter and even through next summer. Leaf mulch helps protect your trees and shrubs by stabilizing soil temperatures, and slowing evaporation of water from the soil. This will help protect trees and shrubs stressed by high temperatures and drought. Since stressed plants are more prone to disease and insect damage, using a good mulch can reduce the need for insecticides and fungicides. A good layer of mulch will also suppress weed growth and reduced the amount of time you need to spend weeding or applying herbicides.

You can spread the shredded leaves around trees and shrubs as mulch. Several inches of shredded leaves will keep the ground moist, and protect plants from frequent freeze/thaw cycles.

Leaves shredded with a mower can be left on the lawn. They will decompose through the winter and add organic material to your lawn soil.
